About the Master of Art History and Curatorial Studies

The Master of Art History and Curatorial Studies program offers research-led seminars in a range of fields and diverse perspectives based on the cutting-edge research conducted by staff in the ANU Centre for Art History and Art Theory. Students wishing to pursue a research project in greater depth have the opportunity to apply for the Master of Art History and Curatorial Studies (Advanced) which can also provide a pathway into the PhD program.

In conjunction with the national institutions and galleries around Canberra, a widely acclaimed internship program is available, which counts towards the overall degree. These competitive internships run over two semesters and count towards the overall degree.

Master of Art History and Curatorial Studies students learn to:

- Differentiate and critique at an advanced level the historical, social, cultural and political contexts of diverse periods, styles, and methods in Art History
- Closely analyse at an advanced level individual works of art, and interpret and communicate ideas to both specialist and non-specialist audiences using disciplinary language and conventions
- Construct comprehensive linkages between the study of art history and the practicalities involved with many roles within the arts sector including curating
- Undertake independent research.

Admission requirements

At a minimum, all applicants must meet program-specific academic/non-academic requirements, and English language requirements. Admission to most ANU programs is on a competitive basis. Therefore, meeting all admission requirements does not automatically guarantee entry.

- A Bachelor degree or international equivalent AND a Graduate Certificate or Graduate Diploma with a GPA of at least 4/7 for the Master of Art History and Curatorial Studies
- A cognate Bachelor degree or international equivalent with a minimum GPA of 5/7 and the approval of an identified supervisor for the thesis for the Master of Art History and Curatorial Studies
- All applicants must meet the University's English Language Admission Requirements for Students.
