It provides training in political science research methods in addition to courses on the contemporary politics of Australia, Asia and other major regions of the world.



What will I study?

Students can choose from a wide selection of topics including political theory, methods of studying politics, voter behaviour, authoritarianism and democracy.

The program will be of interest to those intending to pursue research-oriented careers in government, international organisations, NGOs and private bodies, and to those intending further study in the field.

Admission requirements

- Bachelor degree or international equivalent with a GPA of at least 5.0/7.0 (6.0/7.0 GPA for the Advanced program).
- All applicants must meet the University's English Language Admission Requirements for Students.
- At a minimum, all applicants must meet program-specific academic/non-academic requirements, and English language requirements.
- Admission to most ANU programs is on a competitive basis. Therefore, meeting all admission requirements does not automatically guarantee entry.
- Students wishing to pursue a research project during the Masters program may apply for transfer to the Master of Political Science (Advanced), subject to a GPA of 6.0/7.0 in the first year of the program.

Further study

This program prepares students for Higher Degree Research in Political Science – Master of Philosophy (MPhil) and Doctor of Philosophy (PhD). Internationally recognised, this degree also paves the way to pursuing a PhD overseas.

The Master of Political Science (Advanced) program includes the requirement to complete a thesis. High-performing students are able to frame their own research topic and are matched with an academic supervisor who holds expertise in the relevant field. The thesis is worth 24 units of credit and can be completed part-time or full-time.
