

The minimum academic requirement is a Bachelor degree or international equivalent with a minimum GPA of 4/7 and all applicants must meet program-specific academic entry requirements including English language requirements.

Degree	Description	Duration
Graduate Certificate of Cross-Cultural Analysis	Designed for those understanding people in specific contexts, this program equips students with critical thinking to analyze human lives crossculturally. It emphasizes ethnography in anthropological research, exploring interdisciplinary applications. Includes Indigenous knowledges, gender analysis, global multicultural contexts.	0.5 Year FT *
Graduate Certificate of Demography	The only postgraduate certificate of its kind offered in Australia, which provides an opportunity to study population issues in a research-led environment, with a focus on applying learning to real-world scenarios.	0.5 Year FT *
Graduate Certificate of General and Applied Linguistics	This program will introduce you to linguistic theory, analysis, and associated methodologies, and offer the opportunity to study language as a cognitive, social, and historical process.	0.5 Year FT or 1 Year PT
Graduate Certificate of Middle Eastern & Central Asian Studies	Study in small groups with country experts and gain a deep regional grounding from multiple interdisciplinary perspectives. This degree can also be your pathway into further graduate study, such as our Master of Middle East and Central Asian Studies.	0.5 Year FT or 1 Year PT
Graduate Certificate of Museum and Heritage Studies	Drawing on our strong connections with Canberra's leading cultural and collecting institutions, this program prepares you for a career in museum and heritage studies.	Part-time only: 1 Year

Graduate Certificate in the Repatriation of Ancestral Remains and Cultural Objects	As repatriation accelerates, this unique Graduate Certificate meets the need for advanced knowledge in Indigenous ancestral remains and cultural materials repatriation. Our Master degrees

Admission to our Master degrees is on a competitive basis and meeting all admission requirements does not automatically guarantee entry. The minimum academic requirement is a Bachelor degree or international equivalent with a minimum GPA of 5/7 and all applicants must meet program-specific academic entry requirements (if applicable) including English language requirements. If you do have a cognate degree, you may be able to fast-track your Master degree by 6 or 12 months.

Most of the Master programs below also have an advanced option, which you may transfer to after at least 24 units with GPA 6/7 and the written agreement of an academic staff member to supervise your thesis.

Master of Archaeological and Evolutionary Science	Giving you access to world-class laboratory facilities to enhance your practical, analytical, and interpretive skills in the world of archaeology and evolutionary science.	2 Years FT
Master of Art History and Curatorial Studies	Offering the opportunity to study Australian, Asian and Western art across a wide-range of periods with our award-winning specialist art historians.	1 Year FT
Master of Contemporary Art Practices	A practice-focused, cross-disciplinary degree aimed at artists and designers who want to develop independent creative practice which incorporates research methodologies.	1 Year FT
