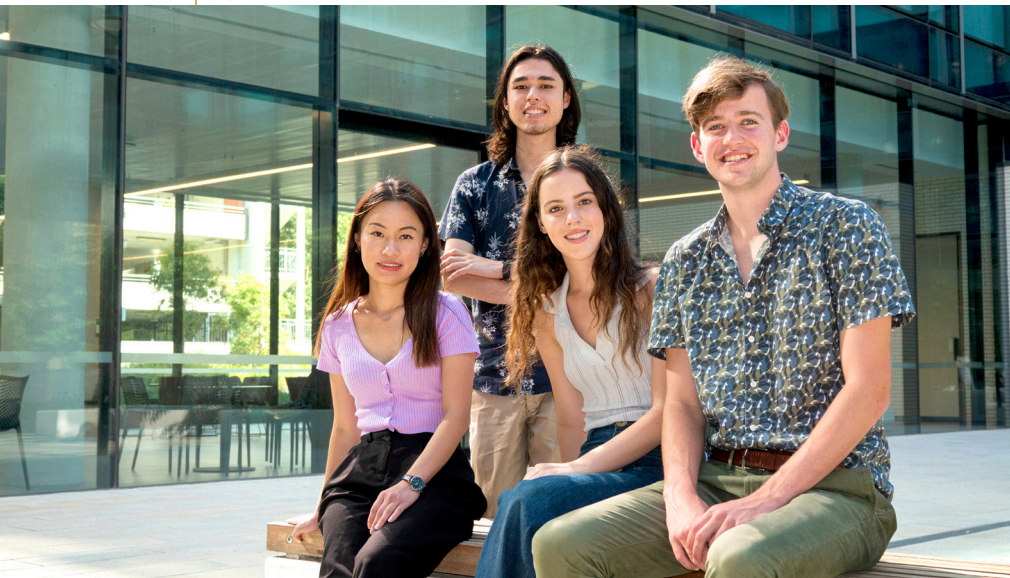

ANU is ranked among the world's top universities, and has a strong international reputation in humanities, arts and social sciences.¹ By studying Arts at ANU, you will receive a world-class education and graduate with an internationally recognised degree. You will also benefit from close access to lecturers and tutors in a supportive learning environment.

As a Bachelor of Arts student, you will take advantage of the University's unique location in Australia's national capital. Internship opportunities are available through the Australian National Internships Program (ANIP), allowing you the opportunity to go into a workplace and undertake a research project for academic credit. You will have regular access to the many cultural and political institutions for study and research, and opportunities to hear from guest lectures by diplomats and policymakers, and public figures.

ANU has a vibrant international community, with staff and students from more than 50 nations. This global experience is a key feature of the Bachelor of Arts.

The breadth of disciplines in an Arts degree allows you to study key regions of significance to Australia including Central Asia and the Middle East. ANU is the only Australian university to be a member of the International Alliance of Research Universities (IARU), a select group of eleven of the world's leading research-intensive universities that share similar values, a global vision and a commitment to educating future leaders.

Bachelor of Arts students learn to:

- critically apply theoretical frameworks and research techniques to understanding national and international issues and problems
- identify relevant sources of information, and judge the importance, reliability and ethical implications of those sources
- evaluate ideas and develop creative solutions to problems, including through independent pursuit of knowledge and making connections between different disciplinary approaches and methods; and
- communicate and debate orally and in writing, and work with others, using a variety of media.

While many degree programs are structured to train students for a single profession, today's graduates are likely to change career paths four or five times during their working life. Through your Arts degree, you will develop lifelong skills in critical analysis, research, written and oral communication.
