The Bachelor of Political Science is the only degree of its type in Australia offering unparalleled access and connections to the corridors of Australian and international politics. The comparative nature of courses means you will develop an understanding of different systems of government, including the foundations of Australia's federal parliamentary system, using comparative methodology. The program places an emphasis on students developing their research and analytical skills, offering courses on political theory, empirical methods and specialised courses.

Students in this unique degree will examine:

- Political theory
- Public opinion and electoral behavior
- Political economy
- Governments and policies
- Systems of government and institutions
- Different methods of social science research

Career opportunities

The Bachelor of Political Science at The Australian National University (ANU) will give you the knowledge, theoretical grounding and practical skills that underpin a successful career that engages with politics.

After completing the Bachelor of Political Science, you will graduate with a degree that is globally recognised and attractive to employers, with well-developed skills in research, critical and conceptual thinking and problem solving.

Graduates may find work in government, the public service, international organisations, non-government organisations such as aid and welfare groups, lobbying, consultancy and many other fields.

Political Science at ANU

ANU is ranked 1st in Australia and 11th in the world in politics.¹ Our research is world-renowned, with ninety-six per cent of broad-field research at ANU rated above or well above world standard.²

Political Science can be studied in the Bachelor of Political Science, as a major in the Bachelor of Arts or the Bachelor of Policy Studies, or as a minor in any one of many ANU degrees. Courses in political science can be included in most undergraduate degrees at ANU and our commitment to research-led education means that you will be taught by some of the world's finest political scientists.

Studying in the national capital means you'll have access to a range of valuable resources unique to Canberra. ANU has many connections with the Australian Government and a range of non-government organisations. Canberra is home to the diplomatic community and members of embassies regularly visit ANU for events. Parliament House is only a short distance from the University, where you can witness politics first hand.

By choosing to study political science at ANU, you will receive a world-class education and an internationally recognised degree.

Internships & study abroad opportunities

Internships offer a myriad of opportunities in Australia and abroad. From Canberra's embassies, Public Service, and Australian Parliament, to study tours. ANU is the only university with a Commonwealth Parliamentary internship program. ANU political science students have the opportunity to apply for an internship through the Australian National Internships Program (ANIP), undertaking a research project for academic credit. Moreover, you can complete part of your degree abroad

attending courses at our partner universities.

Flexible Double Degree
