Public Policy Studies at ANU

Our program is designed to develop the skills and knowledge you need to gather and analyse a range of economic, demographic and social data, to evaluate public policies and programs, and to participate in policy design, advocacy and communication.

- Define conceptual frameworks for public policy
- Understand who and what is involved in the development and implementation of public policy
- Apply research skills in the development and evaluation of evidence-based policy
- Gather and analyse economic data related to public policy
- Create connections between topics and issues related to Australian public policies
- Apply practical experience with policy development through an internship.

Internships

In Public Policy, you can apply to do an internship through the Australian National Internships Program (ANIP) — anip.anu.edu.au.

This program provides you with hands-on opportunities to undertake a research project in a workplace for which you will gain academic credit. Through ANIP, you can be placed with the Australian Federal Parliament, the Australian Public Service, the Australian Capital Territory Legislative Assembly or Public Service or with non-government organisations. This opportunity is an excellent starting point for a career in public policy.

Flexible Double Degree

The Bachelor of Public Policy can be combined with degrees in Arts, Social Sciences, Business, Science or Law as part of the ANU Flexible Double Degree program.
