The Bachelor of Languages at ANU prepares you for the increasingly international and multilingual life, politics, and business of the 21st century.

You will be taken on a language learning journey through which you will attain a strong foundation in two or more languages, including knowledge of linguistics (the science of language), and the history, culture and societies in which these languages are spoken.

You may also choose from a wide range of electives across the University including psychology, business and science, which will further enhance your language-learning and where in the world you choose to take it.

Graduating with a Bachelor of Languages will equip you with advanced communicative proficiency and confidence in at least one language. There is a wide variety of choice, with ANU offering more languages than any other Australian university, including in European, Asian, Middle Eastern, Australian Indigenous and Classical languages.

Career opportunities

This degree will be right for you if you are interested in working in organisations, businesses, or in government dealing with international trade, development, aid, or diplomacy, or working internationally.

Graduates of the Bachelor of Languages may find work in diplomacy, trade, defence, translation, language analysis, language teaching or lecturing, public relations, language consultancy in the travel and tourism industry and many other fields.

Languages at ANU

As a Bachelor of Languages student you will learn to:

- Communicate proficiently and confidently in at least one language
- Identify the structure and uses of languages
- Recognise and contrast the societies and cultures of the languages chosen, and their sociohistorical context
- Construct a global schema of the connections between the languages studied and their geographical, social and cultural origins
- Recognise the importance and value of intercultural communication.

ANU also hosts the widest range of languages out of all Australian universities, allowing you to tailor your language learning journey according to your specific interests and goals.

The ANU also created the state-of-the-art Ethel Tory Centre, a teaching space especially designed to enable a collaborative and technologically enhanced language learning experience throughout your studies.

In addition, minors are available in Burmese, Literary Chinese, Japanese Linguistics, Mongolian, Russian, Tetum, and Tok Pisin.

Other languages such as Cantonese, Indigenous Australian Languages, Taiwanese, Tibetan and Turkish can be taken as electives.

Study abroad opportunities

There are opportunities to go on an exchange semester or year at one of the University's overseas partner

institutions. During your exchange, you can immerse yourself in the language and culture of your chosen country and experience firsthand what you have learned about in the classroom. Scholarships are available to assist with the travel and living expenses of studying abroad.

Flexible Double Degree
