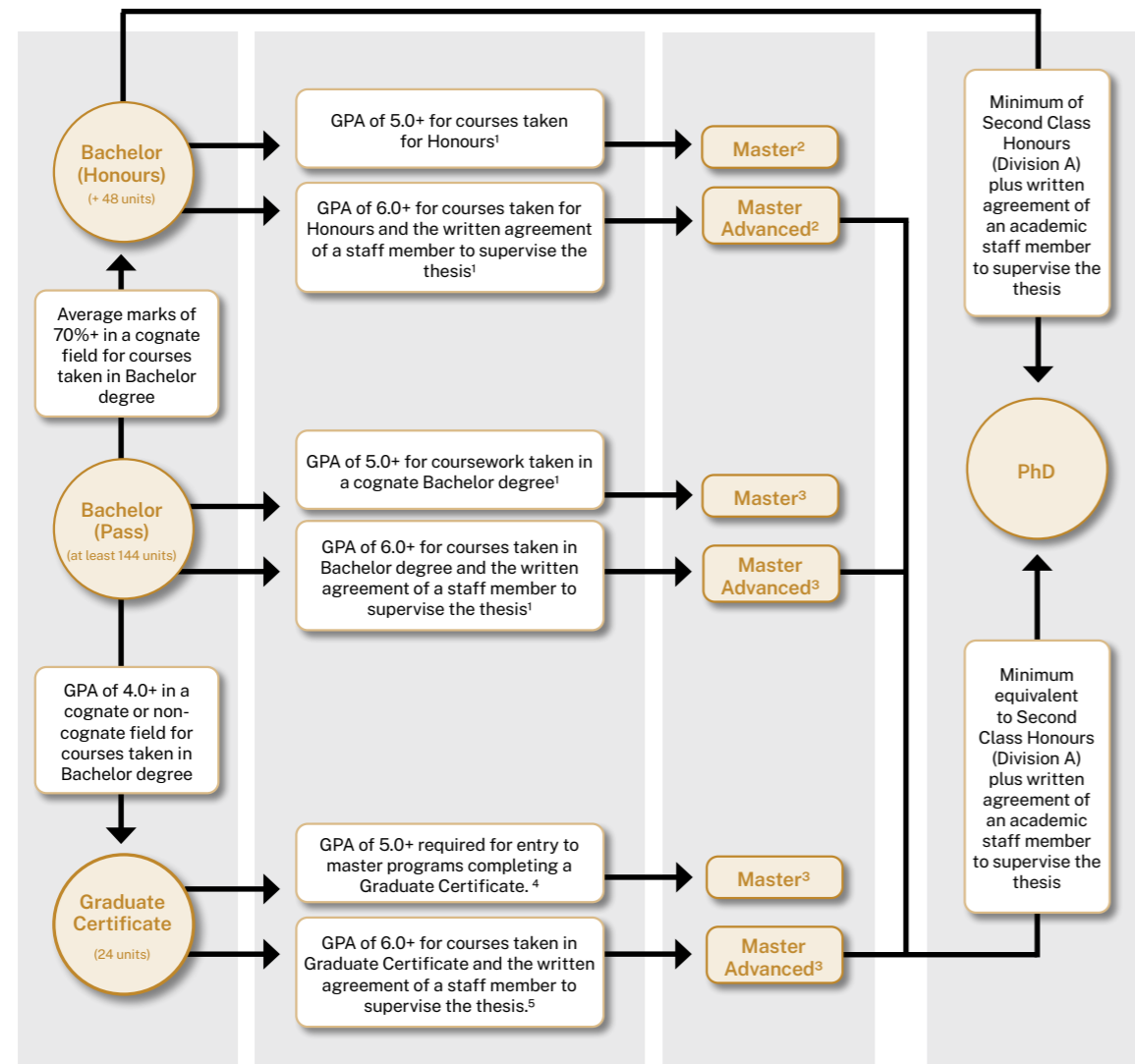


Your degree pathway

Not sure where to begin? Determine what program may be right for you given your prior level of study and previous qualifications by referring to the minimum standards for consideration in the table below.



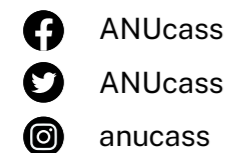
- Please note that Master degrees may have additional entry requirements.
- Students with an Honours degree may receive up to 48 units specified or unspecified credit towards their Master program, if approved by the Program Convenor.
- Students may receive up to 24 units of credit for a cognate Bachelor program or Graduate Certificate.
- Admission to some PG programs can require a grade point average (GPA) as low as 4.0 for students who hold a cognate graduate certificate. Seek advice from ANU Admissions to see if this applies to you.
- GPA of 5.0+ may be accepted if Graduate Certificate is in a cognate discipline.

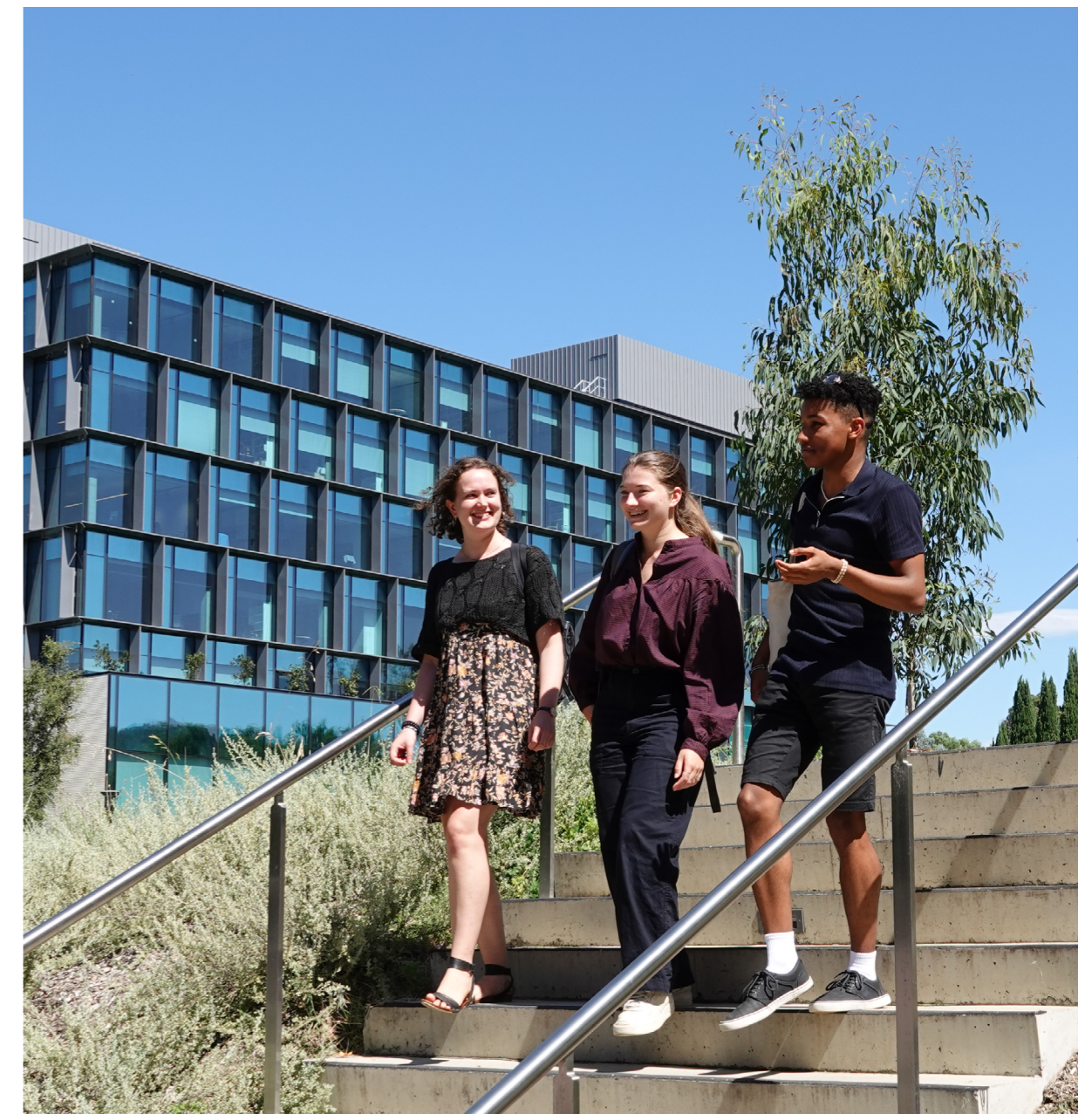

As the leading research university in Australia, all specialised Bachelor degrees have an Honours year available. Honours and Advanced Masters can be a pathway to higher research degrees.

- Students can apply for a 'Year in Asia' program to China, Indonesia, Japan, Korea, Thailand or Vietnam.

- Commencement in Semester 2 is possible, depending on existing language skills (spoken and written); beginners must commence in Semester 1.
